


Stonehouse Neighbourhood Plan: **GETTING AROUND**



Stonehouse has good access to the M5 motorway with the A419 giving access to Stroud and Swindon to the east. Stonehouse railway station connects to Swindon London, Gloucester and Cheltenham, and there are regular buses to Stroud and Gloucester.

Stonehouse railway station has the following services:


ROUTE	FREQUENCY
London to Cheltenham	Monday to Friday (eight trips) Saturday (seven trips) Sunday (six trips)
London to Worcester	Saturday (one trip)
Swindon to Cheltenham	Monday to Friday (one trip)
Swindon to Gloucester	Monday to Friday (six trips) Saturday (seven trips) Sunday (four trips)
Swindon to Worcester	Monday to Saturday (one trip)

The plan shows the location of bus stops in the town.

PUBLIC BUS SERVICES

NUMBER	TO/FROM	FREQUENCY
14	Stroud to Gloucester	Monday to Saturday (every 60 mins) Sunday (four trips)
20	Stroud to Dursley	Monday to Saturday (every 60 mins)
21	Stroud to Stonehouse	Monday to Friday (every 20 mins) Saturday (every 30 mins)

- Access to Bristol and the South West by train from Stonehouse involves a change at either Swindon or Cheltenham or travel to Cam & Dursley station.
- It has been identified that traffic volumes are a big issue for the town, especially in the High Street.
- There is an extensive network of footpaths, and bridleways in and around the town.
- National Cycle Network route 45 passes through Stonehouse close to the canal, and the Cotswold way on the outskirts.
