1. One vase of three stems of floribunda cluster roses (one or more varieties).
2. A specimen hybrid tea rose.
3. One vase of three blooms of HT Roses (one or more varieties—a bud is a bloom).
4. A container of miniature roses (five stems of one or more varieties).

## **SWEET PEAS**

5. One vase of sweet peas (of at least 18 stems, mixed colours), arranged for effect with any foliage or grasses.
6. One vase of sweet peas of at least nine stems, three or more different colours.
7. One vase of sweet peas (seven stems of one colour).

## OTHER FLOWERS

**“The Dr David Cross Flower Trophy”  
plus a £25 voucher will be awarded to the exhibitor  
gaining the most number of points in classes 8 to 16**

- 8\*. One vase of annuals, one kind, five stems.
- 9\*. One vase of perennials, one kind, five stems.
10. A foliage pot plant, up to a 20cm (8 inch) pot
11. A flowering pot plant, up to a 20cm (8 inch) pot—not to be a fuchsia or pelargonium (geranium)
12. A pelargonium (geranium), up to a 20cm (8 inch) pot.
13. A fuchsia plant, up to a 20cm (8 inch) pot.
- 14\*. One vase of mixed flowering shrubs (not less than three varieties).
15. A vase of Dahlias - five blooms ( NB a bud counts as a bloom - please remove buds)
16. A mixed flower patio pot, not to exceed 46cm (18 inch)
17. Mayor’s Challenge Vase (see separate rules & notes on pages 7 & 8.

**\* Vase neck in classes 8, 9 and 14 not to exceed 10cm (4 inch) in diameter.**

### **“The Jeff Ross Memorial Cup”**

**The Cup will be awarded to the exhibitor judged to have entered the “most outstanding” entry within Classes 18 to 35**

### **“The David Lane Memorial Shield”**

**The Shield will be awarded to the exhibitor gaining the most number of points in classes 18 to 34**

18. Three Courgettes, with or without the flowers
19. Three globe beetroot, 7.5cm (3 inch) tops trimmed.
20. Runner beans, six pods.
21. Three onions, their tops dressed.
22. Dish of six shallots, tops tied with raffia
23. Soft fruits, one variety, one dish of no more than 12 items.
24. Tomatoes, a plate of 4, any variety with calyces
- 24a. 6 Cherry Tomatoes any variety with calyces
25. Dish or plate of four potatoes (white variety).
26. Dish or plate of four potatoes (coloured variety).
27. Collection of four herbs for culinary use, cut and displayed.
28. Six French Beans
29. Edible flowers
30. Five carrots of one variety, 7.5cm (3 inch) tops trimmed.
31. Any **other** kind of vegetable not mentioned, in reasonable quantity eg a pair of marrows, six pods of peas etc
32. Any three different heritage vegetables or fruit grown from seed packets to be displayed
33. Cucumber, one pair—to be shown with or without flowers
34. Collection of vegetables (not less than 3 kinds) on a tray or in a basket (not to exceed 46x61cm (18x24 inches))
35. Most humorous vegetable or fruit —entries will be accepted on morning of show for this class ONLY

### **FLORAL ART SECTION**

**The Rotary Club of Stonehouse Cup plus £25 will be awarded to the entry judged as the “most outstanding” within the Floral Art classes**

36. An arrangement to celebrate the Platinum Jubilee—not to exceed 60cm w x 60cm (24” x 24”) height unlimited
37. An exhibit featuring a single stem and foliage - not to exceed 30cm x 30 cm (12” x 12”) height unlimited
38. An exhibit incorporating a Cup & Saucer - not to exceed 25cm x 25cm (10” x 10”) height unlimited
39. A contemporary exhibit -not to exceed 45cm x 45cm, (18” x 18”) height unlimited)
40. An exhibit to include a jug - maximum height of jug 20cm (8”) - not to exceed 45cm x 45cm (18” x 18” ) height unlimited  
Open to anyone NOT having won a floral art class at Stonehouse previously (**Novice class**)
41. An arrangement incorporating flowers of the commonwealth

**Please note that table cloths are white.**

**Within the above Classes 36 to 41 inclusive, material can be used from any source but not to include any artificial plant material.**

## NOTES FOR EXHIBITORS AND JUDGES.

See also pages 16 & 17 for entry rules

- \* Flowering stems can be taken from **ANY** flowering plant.
- \* The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, Pinks, Carnations and Sweet William - which are all dianthus - would not be different kinds.
- \* Only fresh, home-grown flowers can be used **except** in the Floral Art section.
- \* A vase, by definition, is a vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point.
- \* The Mayor's Challenge Vase class is open only to exhibitors living within the GL10 postcode but is not intended purely for growers who regularly display single species classes at shows.
- \* Judges are requested to use their discretion when judging the Mayor's Challenge Vase bearing in mind that the entries may come from inexperienced exhibitors.
- \* When points are awarded they should be clearly marked by the judges on the exhibitors' cards.
- \* Any queries that may arise regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.

**Failure to abide by any of these rules will lead to disqualification.**

## MAYOR'S CHALLENGE VASE

**Open to residents living within the GL10 postcode.**

The Mayor's Challenge Vase class is for mixed flowering stems containing a total of between five and ten stems, taken from a minimum of two different kinds of plants. Please note that it is two different **KINDS of plants**, two varieties of the same plant are **NOT** two kinds.

The display will be judged out of a total of 35 points, split into: 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display, and 10 points for the overall presentation and effect of the flowers in the vase. The vase will be viewed from all directions. Judging of the flowers should be to the normal rules used for other classes.

Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only, no seed heads or berries will be allowed. The vase can be any shape and size and made from any material, but must be in proportion to the display. No marks are awarded for the vase itself.

No accessories such as bows and additional foliage will be allowed. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to the stem, is allowed.

Packing material (including Oasis) to keep the stems in place is allowed.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. All exhibits must have been grown in the competitors own garden or allotment for at least 2 months prior to the Show date and, in the Handicraft and Art classes, should have been created within the last 2 years.
2. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry & their decision relating to disqualification of any entry, the award of prizes or any matter whatsoever shall be final.
3. Entry forms must be received no later than the time & date stated on the entry form.
4. **Entry to ALL classes in 2022 is FREE**
5. Prize money will NOT be awarded in 2022
6. If there are less than 4 entries in any class the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> certificates may be withheld at the discretion of the judge.
7. On Show day exhibits can be received and staged from **8.00am to 9.30am after reporting to the Show Secretary on arrival**. At **9.45am** the exhibition area will be cleared for judging.
8. The exhibition area will be open to the public **AFTER JUDGING HAS FINISHED**.
9. At **5pm** exhibitors may remove their exhibits.
10. All exhibits must be removed by **6pm**. Any left after this time will be disposed of.
11. The points awarded to The Dr David Cross Flower Trophy, the David Lane Memorial Shield will be 1<sup>st</sup> three points, 2<sup>nd</sup> two points, 3<sup>rd</sup> one point.  
In the event of equality of points the judge's decision will be final.

12. A Judge may recommend that a 1<sup>st</sup> prize will not be awarded where there are only 2 entries.
13. Competitors may exhibit only **ONE** entry in each class.
14. Competitors shall supply their own vases and bowls. Cut flowers should be exhibited in holders which may be readily moved without detriment to the exhibits.
15. Objection to any exhibit must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 2pm on show day. The decision of the organisers will be final.
16. The organisers will not be responsible for the loss of any exhibit, or for any damage it may sustain, but every care will be taken of exhibits.
17. **Cups** will be presented at **4.30pm**. All cups are perpetual and must be returned to the Show Secretary **TWO WEEKS** before the next show.
18. Not applicable
19. Not applicable
20. No cards other than those issued by the organisers may be placed on any exhibit, with the exception of the names of the varieties where required, until after the exhibits are judged.
21. Infringement of any of the rules may be penalised by forfeiture of any prizes awarded.
22. **All Classes:** Exhibitors must comply with all instructions and given dimensions when stated within individual classes. When stated sizes are given, they must be adhered to.
